Dear Friend of the Coast,



But this month so much is taking place that we're bringing you news updates. Thousands of acres of coastal forested wetlands are being ditched without permits, and the N.C. General Assembly is looking to virtually wipe out safeguards for the small remaining parcels of coastal wetlands. (Remember - "No Wetlands - No Seafood.") A developer wants to build a new subdivision on a former inlet. And proposed budget cuts would curtail a water quality sampling program that keeps our shellfish and swimming waters safe to use, and severely cut the state's capacity to attract millions of dollars in grants for

Rich Inlet Threatened with Groin

Figure Eight Island is one of four beach communities planning to build terminal groins along the state's coast. All are in various stages of the environmental review process required by federal law. Several homeowners on the island's north end near Rich's Inlet will not allow the groin to be built on their properties. This has resulted in a new proposal to move the groin further into the inlet in an attempt to bypass these landowners. The new proposed location of the groin is no ordinary place. It would destroy salt marsh, and cause the low sand spit that provides critical habitat for birds to nest and a place for people to land their boats to erode away. Meanwhile, the erosion problems for some oceanfront houses that originally prompted interest in building the groin no longer exist.

Corps Alleges Illegal Ditching in Hofmann
After a three-month investigation instigated by the federation, the Army Corps of Engineers thinks illegal ditching may have affected 6,500 acres of wetlands in Hofmann Forest.
