Hammocks Beach to Expand

If all goes according to plan, Hammocks Beach State Park will be on a scale similar to Fort Macon State Park and Jockey's Ridge State



Park. After years in the courts, a settlement has been reached with the Hurst family to purchase the property near Queens Creek in Onslow County. The 289-acres will be added to Hammocks Beach State Park. The state budget will provide \$3 million of the \$10.3 million. Additional funding will come from the Parks and Recreation Trust Fund.
