Dear Friend of the Coast.

You've probably heard us talk about the 6,000-acre North River Farms in eastern Carteret County. It's one of the nation's largest wetland and estuary restoration projects. It began in 1999 with a lot of help from the N.C. Clean Water Management Trust Fund, other federal and state agencies and lots of volunteers. So far around 2,800 acres of wetlands have been restored, and over 1,000 acres preserved. In the coming weeks, we will begin the final phase of restoration.

This will provide productive wildlife habitat and restore shellfish water quality in tidal coastal waters. We can already see improvements. Water quality has improved so that some shellfishing areas have opened back up, new birds and animals have been spotted and more oysters are being harvested.

Groin Not Cost-Effective for Bogue Inlet

While some N.C. beach communities are considering jetties (terminal groins) to stabilize inlets and halt beach erosion, Carteret County beach managers have decided that a groin at Bogue Inlet would be too



expensive and ineffective. They considered using a terminal groin at the inlet which separates Emerald Isle (Carteret County) from Bear Island (Onslow County) along the central N.C. coast, to control erosion, but after research, decided against it. Read the full <u>CRO story</u>.
