The Hawai'ian culture is rich with ancient ceremony and tradition and many of the protocols and rituals of a time long past are still respected and practiced today, including the pule (blessing) of the canoe. Hoku Kai (sea star) is the name of the va'a (canoe) we will be paddling for this journey. Join us for a traditional Hawai'ian blessing to launch our journey.

Friday, September 13th

- ✓ Crew departs Buxton (via the canal behind the Swell Motel) early morning
- ✓ Crew paddles 23 miles to the Rodanthe public boat ramp for crew change
- ✓ Crew paddles 27 miles to Jockey's Ridge State Park, stops for the evening

Saturday, September 14th

- ✓ Crew launches from Jockey's Ridge State Park
- ✓ Crew paddles 25 miles to Audubon's Pine Island for crew change
- ✓ Crew paddles to the Virginia border, then back to conclude at Historic Corolla Park

All are welcome to join us Saturday evening at Historic Corolla Park for a celebration to honor the completion of this three-year, 325-mile journey!
