Protect North Carolina's Wetlands - Speak Up Now!

The EPA is revising the definition of "waters of the United States." This rule could strip protections from streams and wetlands, putting our communities, wildlife, and economy at risk.

Why Wetlands Matter

- Flood Protection: Wetlands absorb and slow floodwaters—one acre can hold up to 1 million gallons of water.
- Clean Water: Wetlands filter pollutants and help recharge groundwater aquifers.
- **Seafood & Economy:** Healthy wetlands support fisheries, 5,500 jobs, and nearly \$300 million for NC's economy.
- **Wildlife & Recreation**: Wetlands provide habitat for fish, birds, and other wildlife, supporting hunting, fishing, and tourism.
- **Community & Safety**: Wetlands reduce damage from storms, protect property, and help control insurance costs.

What's at Risk with the Proposed Rule?

- Smaller streams and wetlands could lose federal protections.
- Unchecked development could increase flooding, pollution, and habitat loss.
- North Carolina could lose control over protections tailored to our unique resources.
- Once wetlands are developed, the damage cannot be reversed.
