Custom Recognition & Sponsorship Opportunities

EDUCATION & EVENT CENTER - \$1,000,000 RESERVED

The Education & Event Center will be the heart of the Center's education and engagement mission, hosting local events and business meetings as well as remote learning opportunities.

FEDERATION HEADQUARTERS - \$1,000,000 RESERVED

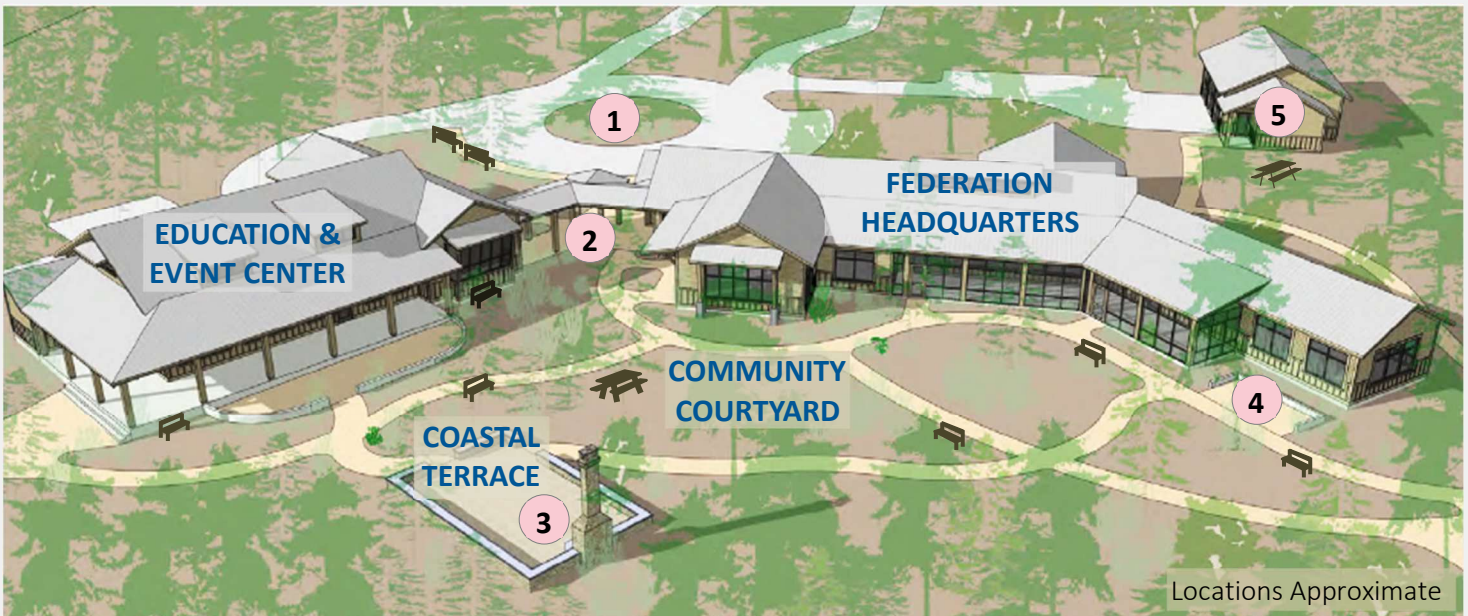
The Coastal Resource Center will be a hub of collaborative leadership, housing the federation's team, meeting spaces, the Communications Studio, Welcome Center, Coastal Library, and Gift Shop.

COMMUNITY COURTYARD - \$250,000

The Community Courtyard will be an inviting gathering space for visitors touring the grounds or coastal professionals stepping outside for conversation, fresh air, and to enjoy the view.

COASTAL TERRACE - \$150,000 RESERVED

The Coastal Terrace will serve as an outdoor classroom for students, a staging area for volunteer activities, a gathering place for celebrations, as well as an open space for the public.

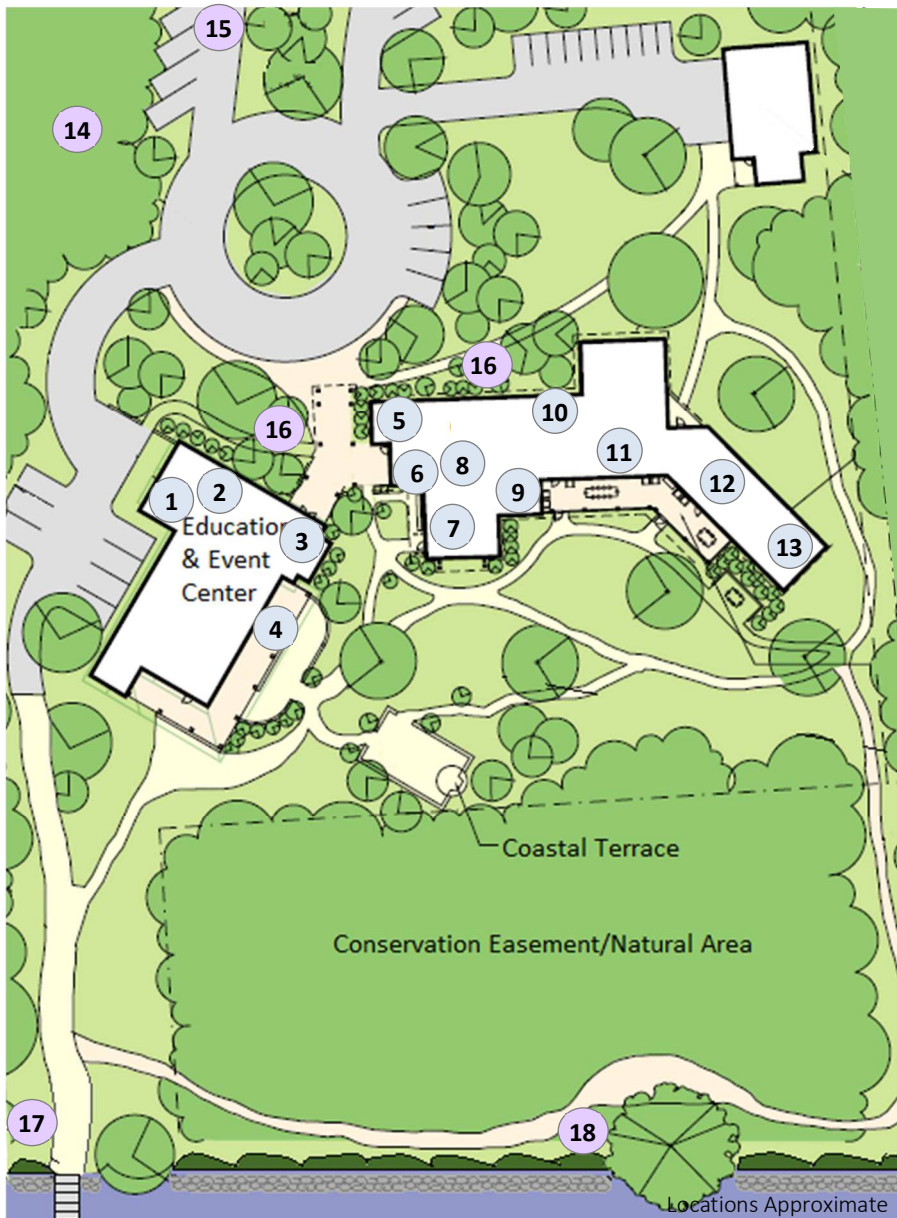
Visitors will connect with nature through special features in a gorgeous coastal setting.

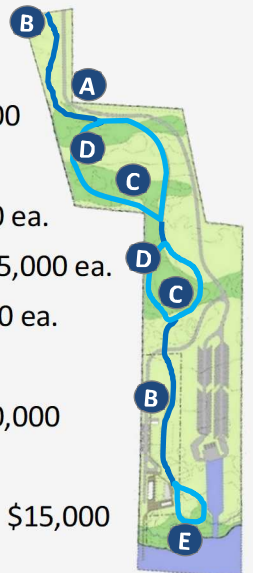
